

Frequently asked questions about Adequan® Canine (polysulfated glycosaminoglycan)

ABOUT ADEQUAN® CANINE

What is Adequan® Canine?

Adequan® Canine (polysulfated glycosaminoglycan or PSGAG) is the only FDA-approved disease-modifying osteoarthritis drug (DMOAD) for dogs. It is recommended for the control of signs associated with non-infectious degenerative and/or traumatic arthritis of canine synovial joints.

Are there age or breed restrictions for Adequan® Canine?

No age or breed restrictions; use in pregnant, breeding or lactating animals has not been evaluated.

How fast does Adequan® Canine work?

It reaches the joint within 2 hours.¹ It may take a few days before a clinical difference is seen. Consult your veterinarian if you have any questions.

WHY ADEQUAN® CANINE

There are many supplements and over-the-counter products making similar claims to Adequan® Canine. However, these products are only supported by statements and do not have the product testing and trials Adequan® Canine completed to obtain FDA-approval.

HOW TO USE

How can I learn whether Adequan® Canine may be right for my dog?

Consult your veterinarian on whether Adequan® Canine may be appropriate for your dog's arthritis. Federal law restricts this drug to use by or on the order of a licensed veterinarian

What is the treatment protocol for a dog starting with Adequan® Canine?

Consult your veterinarian on treatment protocol and whether Adequan® Canine may be an appropriate treatment for your dog.

Can Adequan® Canine help all kinds of dogs?

While certain breeds are predisposed, canine arthritis is common in all kinds of dogs, affecting younger dogs as well as older ones.

Talk to your veterinarian.

If you notice your dog slowing down, ask your veterinarian if Adequan® Canine can help.

SAFETY INFORMATION

Any Precautions?

The safe use of Adequan® Canine used in breeding, pregnant, or lactating dogs has not been evaluated. Use with caution in dogs with renal or hepatic impairment.

What is the current ISI (Important Safety Information) statement?

Adequan® Canine should not be used in dogs who are hypersensitive to PSGAG or who have a known or suspected bleeding disorder. It should be used with caution in dogs with renal or hepatic impairment. Adverse reactions in clinical studies (transient pain at injection site, transient diarrhea, and abnormal bleeding) were mild and self-limiting. In post approval experience, death has been reported in some cases; vomiting, anorexia, depression/lethargy and diarrhea have also been reported.
